#### The Heroes of October 7th are Revealed

## The story of Anas Owuda – an EMT and ambulance driver in the Gilboa Region

ISRAEL

On Saturday, October 7th, while I was on vacation from work, I was woken by a sudden phone call from my supervisor. In a confused voice, he tells me, "I need you. We don't know what is happening in the south, but something is definitely going on."

I didn't think twice. I got my uniform on and got to the station in order to collect my protective equipment and make it for an important briefing. I left for Ofakim. All the way to the south, I was hearing on the radio reports and news, but I refused to believe. We weren't yet aware of the magnitude of the attacks.

My thoughts are cut off immediately when a military vehicle in front of me signals me to stop. The commander comes out to me clearly agitated and tells me he has three wounded soldiers in the vehicle. Despite the shock, I check them and I see one is in critical condition and two more in serious condition. I don't think twice. I take them into my ambulance, give them life-saving treatment and drive as fast as I can to Soroka Hospital.

During the drive, I realize that one of the soldier's conditions is deteri-



orating and I will have to get aerial support for a faster and more efficient evacuation to hospital. After receiving assistance from MDA's emergency call center, I was able to get to Sde Teiman helipad and rendezvous with the MDA medevac helicopter. I transferred the casualties, and for the first time since the morning, I took a breath. I felt that the soldiers are receiving the best treatment right now. From there, not stopping even for a moment, I continue from one casualty to another; from the field to the hospital.

While I was providing treatment to one of the wounded, I noticed from afar people speaking Arabic, and realized that it is a group of Hamas terrorists. I immediately understood that all of us in the area are in great



danger. I got everyone I could see into the first apartment I saw and we hid there. I must mention I was not armed. We waited there for help.

A few minutes later, multiple forces arrived and heavy gunfire began. Together with the Special Forces, they evacuated the remaining citizens under heavy barrages of rockets and nonstop gunfire. Eventually we managed to get out of there and straight away I continued to drive to more scenes and deliver treatment to the wounded.

In one of the evacuations, while I was on my way back from Soroka Hospital to the field, I met a soldier from a special unit with an arm injury. I provided him with initial treatment that included stopping the bleeding. I asked him to come with

me to the hospital where he would receive the treatment he needs, but he insisted that there are still many terrorists around and that taking care of them is his first priority. I wished for him to keep himself safe and prayed to meet him once again, healthy and well.

Countless reports on the communications system. Countless casualties. Teams broken up at the entrance to Soroka Hospital, and yet united as I have never seen them before. I drove without thinking. I saw things without feeling. The only thought that went through my head was that I have to save as many lives as I can, and I hope I succeeded. This is a day I will never forget.

Canadian Magen David Adom mourns the tragic loss of the MDA paramedics, EMTs, and first-responders who were murdered in the horrific attacks on October 7<sup>th</sup> and of those who have been killed in the line of duty since.

### The Tragic Story of Amit Mann z'l

## One of the MDA paramedics and EMTs murdered by Hamas on October **7**<sup>th</sup>

**ISRAEL**

Ambassador Gilad Erdan, Israel's Permanent Representative to the UN, exposed the Hamas brutalities to world leaders and highlighted the horrific murder of MDA paramedic Amit Mann z'l.

MDA paramedic and paramedic instructor in the Negev, Amit Mann z'l, was murdered, shot by Hamas terrorists as they entered the clinic in Kibbutz Be'eri while she was treating the wounded on Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup>. She was besieged for six hours in the Be'eri clinic, treating the wounded and begging for security forces to come. She recorded the terrorists' shots and wrote to her sister: "I don't think I'll get out of this, I love you."

Two days after the chilling message she recorded for and sent to her sister, Lior, as she was besieged with dead and injured in the clinic in Kibbutz Be'eri, the body of Magen David Adom paramedic Amit Mann, 22, was found Monday night - along with over 100 other bodies. Before communication was cut off. Amit



wrote a WhatsApp message to her sister, Haviva, reading: "They're here. They're in the clinic. I don't think I'll make it out of here. I love you."

Lior had been searching for her sister ever since receiving the final message from Amit on Saturday afternoon, in which gunfire can be heard as terrorists took over the clinic. Throughout Saturday, sobbing, she scoured the beds in the wards of Barzilai Hospital in Ashkelon. She pounced on incoming ambulances trying to learn of her sister's fate. "I don't know what's happened to her" she said at

the time. "I'm just so worried waiting for her."

Throughout the nerve-wracking, long hours, Amit and Lior were conversing over WhatsApp — until the communication was cut off. "Do you have more medical personnel with the injured?" asked Lior. Amit responded: "There's a nurse and a dentist here. We're doing what we can."

Lior later asks if there's more shooting. Amit answers: "Yes. It's never ending. It looks like there are more terrorists. They're in people's houses. Army forces have been hit." The conversation ended with Amit writing: "It's not good". Her sister tried to raise her spirits: "Don't lose hope. It's a war and we'll win — we're stronger. Focus on taking care of yourself. It'll be over soon. The army are already operating there." "I love you. Thank you." wrote Amit and didn't write anymore.

Today, after her sister's body was found, in tears, Lior told Ynet: "My heart is broken and bleeding. I just can't take in the bad news. We'll say goodbye to our Amit. She was

the princess of our home, the light of our lives who lost her life in the battle for Be'eri, and as an experienced paramedic, tried saving lives until the last moment when she was murdered by evil terrorists. We love you so much. You'll always be the heroine love of our lives."

In addition to Amit's body, a further 107 bodies were found on Kibbutz Be'eri. Amit was buried in the cemetery in Netivot accompanied by family members and hundreds of her friends. Amit dreamed of studying medicine and continuing to save lives.

MDA Director General Eli Bin on Amit Mann: "Amit was a heroic paramedic who continued to treat the wounded even while terrorists tried to break into the clinic in Kibbutz Be'eri. She sacrificed herself while trying to protect the lives of the patients – her priority was only what was best for them. Her untimely passing left us shocked and in pain. Magen David Adom cherishes all that Amit has done, and our employees and volunteers bow their heads and hug her family. May her memory be blessed."

## Canadian doctors drop everything to go save lives in Israel

#### **ISRAEL**

Each year, CMDA sends a delegation of Canadian physicians to Israel to take part in training seminars, drills, and ambulance shifts with Magen David Adom. Once the physicians complete their training, they become part of MDA's International Physician Unit. The purpose of this unit is to provide additional support to MDA's paramedics and EMTs in times of great need.

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, no one was prepared for the attacks that were carried out and the war that ensued. The need for emergency medical services rose drastically and MDA was in need of additional support in order to re-





spond effectively. CMDA began gathering names of physicians interested in volunteering in Israel during the crisis, and to our amazement, the list exceeded 130 names. Physicians are sent based on the specific demands of MDA, and so far, fifteen Canadian doctors have travelled to Israel to assist with the relief efforts.

Ira Price, from outside of Hamilton, is one of three Canadian physicians who arrived in Israel in the early stages of the war.

"We worked on the individual for such a long period of time and eventually, we are so thankful that we were able to save a life." The girl's parents came to thank him and the other paramedics and EMTs from the team he joined.

"I must say how grateful I am for you, for all of you, for fighting," the father said as his wife cried beside him. "You didn't give up. Because of you, my child is still breathing today."

CMDA continues to send physicians from the International Unit as needed. Should the need grow, we will send more physicians to assist with MDA's vital efforts in this time of war.

### Canadian Donors Secure Replacement Medevac **Helicopter for MDA**

#### **TORONTO**

On Tuesday, October 10th, three days after the onset of the current war, Canadian Magen David Adom received a frantic phone call from their Israeli counterparts. As one of MDA's three helicopters from its fleet had just taken off near the Gaza Strip carrying three wounded and three crew members set to head north to Barzilai Hospital in Ashkelon, a rocket hit and destroyed two of the three rotors. The crew miraculously managed to land the helicopter, but the damage to the rotors was irreversible.

The MDA head staff had advised that an emergency helicopter was needed immediately to replace this one, as purchasing and shipping a new set of rotors to Israel in a timely fashion was impossible. CMDA staff immediately took it upon themselves to find the donors that would be able to support this extremely important initiative of purchasing a multimillion-dollar replacement helicopter to restore this essential part of the fleet.

The helicopter in question is the S-76 Sikorsky Medevac Helicopter and is outfitted with advanced life-saving equipment, including oxygen and medical suction systems. With this vehicle, medics can load and unload patients conveniently and easily, directly communicate with hospitals or other emergency service facilities on the ground, and fit specific air medical missions. The S-76 emergency medical service helicopter exceeds those demands with extra margins of safety, reliability, and medical mission effectiveness.

The first phone call occurred at 9:30 a.m. Eastern Time and by 4:15 p.m., the replacement helicopter was in the works. The incredible generosity of the Roadburg Family Foundation and its board ensured this project was ready to take flight with their donation of two million dollars. At this point in time, we



were ready to order the helicopter and were approximately halfway to the monetary target to fully fund a replacement. This is when we reached out to the benevolent Wynn Family Foundation who were able to put us significantly closer to the full purchase. By the following day, the Fisher Family Foundation generously offered the remaining amount necessary to fully reach the goal of purchasing a replacement S-76 Sikorsky helicopter.

We are eternally grateful for the benevolence of our Canadian donors in funding this vital helicopter, essential for saving thousands of lives. The helicopter is now in the process of shipment and is expected to be making lifesaving flights before the first night of Hanukkah. This is truly a miracle.

The goal: to raise funds for the purchase of an ambulance dedicated to the memory of Yoram, and to station it in Kiryat Shmona in northern Israel. This ambulance will serve the citizens of a region where Yoram was once affectionately known as "The King of the North".

Pastor Rudy Fidel of Faith Temple, a close friend of Yoram z'l, kicked off the evening by sharing touching memories of his friendship with Yoram and the profound impact Yoram had on his life. Sharon Fraiman, CMDA Western Region Director, took the stage to address the tragic losses that Magen David Adom (MDA) experienced on October 7th. MDA lost ten paramedics and EMTs who were courageously trying to reach victims of Hamas' violence on that dark Saturday. Ambulances were lost and equipment was damaged. Sharon made a heartfelt plea to those in attendance, urging them to do whatever they could to support Israel and CMDA.

The evening was filled with beautiful music and heartfelt performances. Jane Enkin & Friends entertained the crowd with klezmer music and wonderful renditions of Yiddish songs that had everyone singing along. John and Irene Plantz brought their unique blend of Jewgrass & Bluegrass to entertain the audience. John shared his deep connection with Israel, his love for the Jewish people, and his commitment to the Winnipeg chapter of CMDA. Shoshana & Friends delivered stunning Israeli songs that had Hebrew speakers in the crowd singing and clapping along.

The legacy of Yoram Hamizrachi East z'l was poignantly shared by his son, Ron East. Yoram's heroic actions during the Six-Day War, his leadership in the security zone of Southern Lebanon, and his role in rescuing Ethiopian Jews exemplified his unwavering dedication to Zionism. In Winnipeg, Yoram was a prominent figure in the local Jewish community, sought after for his expertise on the Middle East, the Arab world, and counter-terrorism.

Chief Jim Bear emotionally spoke of his dear friend Yoram z'l who had served as the economic development director in Little Grand Rapids for eight years. He highlighted Yoram's pivotal role in securing over \$16 million from Ottawa for a water filtration





system that continues to provide fresh drinking water to the remote community.

Pastor Hilda Leveque shared her fond memories of Yoram and the lasting impact he had, not only on her and her family, but also on the entire community of Little Grand Rapids.

By the end of the night, over \$10,000 were raised towards the purchase of the ambulance, bringing the campaign to over \$17,000. 




