Holiday greetings from **Joseph Amzallag**, National President



Since we began commemorating Hanukkah, the candles we light each night during the celebration have become synonymous with the spirit of hope and a way out of the darkness. In these post-Covid times, we can only be grateful that we see a light at the end of the tunnel. As such, Hanukkah is more than a holy ritual

because it is loaded with teachings; especially when we consider that we have just been witness to the greatest experience of the 21st Century.

Gravely injured in a drive-by shooting attack in December, 2018, Shira Ish-Ran survived thanks to Magen David Adom and the many blood transfusions she received. However, Shira was seven months pregnant and had to undergo an emergency Caesarian. Unfortunately, the baby, whom they named Amiad Yisrael, our nation of Israel is eternal, did not survive.

This past August, Shira and her husband, Amichai Ish-Ran, also injured in the attack, welcomed their baby boy, 6 pounds, 5 ounces, Eliya Ro-ee Ish-Ran, at the Shaare Zedek Hospital, the same hospital they were taken to after the attack. Thanking everyone for their good wishes, Shira said, "I had to

receive many blood transfusions and I feel that the Jewish people are supporting me emotionally, giving us strength with every single step with their prayers. But the Jewish people have also strengthened me physically. The blood of the entire Jewish people is flowing through my veins at this very moment."

Blood, the Gift of Life, is in your hands. The Marcus National Blood Services Centre, currently under construction in Ramla, is slated for completion in April/May 2022. This underground, state-of-the-art facility will ensure that Israel's blood supply will be safe from attacks and earthquakes, and will be able to meet the future needs of Israel's growing population.

Dedication and Generosity 'Canada's Magen David Adom Family'

The Yochai Porat Magen David Adom Overseas Program is intended for young adults to volunteer in Israel for a six-week period. The first ten days are devoted to first aid and, following "graduation", the participants become First Aid Responders and are able to volunteer at MDA stations and on ambulances throughout Israel.

Ariella Eisenberg, from Montreal, spent this past summer as a volunteer in the program and was stationed in Haifa. Her sister, Sarah Leah, participated in the program two years ago and is currently studying medicine at the Technion.

Ariella, who today is a student in a medical program in Toronto, described the amazing experience of coexistence with volunteers. "I was happy to volunteer and contribute as part of MDA," she said. Sarah Leah believes that the program played a major role in her choosing medicine as a profession.

Dr. Eli Yaffe, MDA's Deputy Director General and head of the Community Division, said, "We feel a great sense of pride in the hundreds of young people who have decided to spend their summer acquiring remarkable experiences in an extraordinary setting...They have chosen the

value of saving lives and helping others in the State of Israel. Also, they constitute an overseas reserve for Magen David Adom in times of emergency and disaster."

Montreal Doctors Mark Eisenberg and Louise Pilote, the girls' parents, have been generous donors to Canadian Magen David Adom for many years. It was not surprising given the family's history that, when Dr. Eisenberg's father, Dr. David Eisenberg, passed away, his mother, Anna May Eisenberg, chose to donate an ambulance "in honor of the medical profession who

devote their lives to saving others". Said Ariella, "When our grandfather died, Grandma wanted to do something in his memory. I feel closer to my grandfather who worked his whole life to save lives. For our family, there is nothing more important than helping the people of Israel."

The ambulance was dedicated in April in Rochester, New York, at Anna May Eisenberg's residence. "It was very meaningful", said Dr. Mark Eisenberg, "because the dedication coincided with my father's first yahrzeit."

The ambulance is now stationed in Haifa.

The Importance of Family



Sixty Years of Bliss & The Voice of The Cantor

It is not every day that a couple celebrates their 60th Wedding Anniversary. It is not every day that a man who survived the Holocaust by fleeing from his shtetl in Poland and ending up in a Russian labour camp lives to witness the legacy of children and grandchildren. And, it is not every day that a couple chooses to celebrate their anniversary by donating a Mobile Intensive Care Unit (MICU) to the people of Israel in honour of Cantor Shai Abramson.

This is exactly what Sol and Queenie Nayman have done. Shai Abramson is the world-renowned Chief Cantor for the IDF and a volunteer paramedic for Magen David Adom (MDA).

The Naymans and Cantor Abramson met and became friends during the Naymans many trips to Poland and Israel with the March of the Living. A few months ago, the Naymans, with tears in their eyes, watched on their computer as Cantor Abramson serenaded a patient, a Holocaust survivor, who was being taken to hospital. The Cantor also composed two very touching songs honouring MDA paramedics.

This was not the only motivation for the Naymans special gift. It is a family affair. In 2003, Moishe Nayman, at a ceremony in Montreal's Cavendish Mall, donated an ambulance, dedicated to the members of his family who perished in the Shoah.

Sol Nayman's story is one of perseverance. Born in Stoczek Wegrowki, Poland, on November 5th, 1935, he and his family were fortunate to escape to the forest in September, 1939. From there, the Nayman family managed to trace a path to the East, eventually making their way to the Soviet Union. In 1948, the Naymans immigrated to Canada. They settled in Montreal where Sol attended Talmud Torah and Herzliya High School. Sol later moved to Toronto and, with hard work and business acumen, became co-founder of the well-known Canadian brand, Club Monaco.

Sol and Queenie are involved in numerous charitable pursuits which support an array of Jewish and community causes. Queenie, a teacher by profession, is a past president of Mount Sinai Hos-

pital Auxiliary (Toronto). The Naymans have been members of Shaarei Shomayim Congregation since their move to Toronto in 1969.

Sol and Queenie understand why Magen David Adom plays such an important role in saving lives. Without the volunteers and the MDA paramedics they have met on their March of the Living trips, protecting and saving lives of all Israelis would not be possible.

The story of Chanukah is one of hope and light. The Naymans' story is one of hope, light and inspiration.

Sam Switzer – A Wonderful Legacy


CALGARY

Canadian Magen David Adom Brings 'First Seven Minutes Program' to the Tsuut'ina Nation

Bridging Cultures & Savings Lives

CALGARY

On September 30th, the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, Canadians from coast to coast to coast stopped to remember and honour the lost indigenous children and survivors of residential schools, their families, and communities. CMDA Western Region Director, Sharon Fraiman, acknowledged the solemn day on her social media channels. Her heartfelt post included a photo of herself and Ralph Bradley Crane, a member of the Tsuut'ina Nation, both holding brochures for MDA's "First Seven Minutes Program". This lifesaving program will soon be available to members of the Tsuut'ina Nation.

Inspired to build a cultural bridge with the members of the Tsuut'ina Nation, located next door to Calgary, Fraiman reached out to former Chief Lee Crowchild who accepted her invitation to join the local CMDA Board.

"Our friendship and mutual respect came first," says Fraiman. "When Lee was Chief, I saw an inspirational leader with the ability to bridge cultural gaps and bring people together. I knew he would be an excellent fit for our Board, and help provide opportunities to teach lifesaving skills to the Tsuut'ina people through our "First Seven Minutes Program".

"I see myself as a peace builder," says Crowchild. "This is a time of great change for our Nation and we can learn from other cultures as they learn from us. It's the opportunity to work collaboratively."

CMDA Honourary Calgary Chair, Lenny Shapiro, a long time volunteer and supporter, has been encouraging Fraiman to build strong relationships with the Tsuut'ina Nation and other First Nations. "Reconciliation needs to happen at many levels," says Shapiro. "Through respect and understanding we can work together to everyone's benefit."

The "First Seven Minutes Program" is a state-of-the-art seminar on community preparedness and response training for medical emergencies developed by MDA and made available to

communities in dozens of countries around the world.

Pandemic restrictions have delayed the first classes but the program will soon be readily available to Tsuut'ina Nation members. There are plans to provide workshops to staff of the Grey Eagle Casino and Resort. It will also be offered to business and community leaders and anyone interested in taking the program.

"The program will be a good fit for many members of our Nation and in particular for those who like to hunt and get out into the bush. And with more traffic and people moving around the Nation, there's absolutely going to be the need for people to have this vital skillset," says Crowchild, who adds that saving lives is part of Dene tradition. "The Apache are Dene like the Tsuut'ina. Many Apache became fearless firefighters throughout Arizona and New Mexico."

CMDA paramedic, Don Sharpe, will train participants and award certificates of training completion. Sharpe, a paramedic in Calgary for nearly 40 years, has led many "First Seven Minutes Programs" and has trained hundreds of Albertans.



